**Sub: Grant of Extended permission to Aligarh Unani Medical College & ACN Hospital, AUAMC Campus, Kasimpur Road, Aligarh-202002, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID: UNI0309) with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BUMS) course and 08 seats in 02 PG courses namely (i) Moalijat-04 seats and (ii) Kulliyat-04 seats for the academic session 2025-26, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-regarding.**

Sir/Madam,

- To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Aligarh Unani Medical College & ACN Hospital, AUAMC Campus, Kasimpur Road, Aligarh-202002, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID: UNI0309)** inspection was conducted on **30.06.2025 and 01.07.2025**, as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **the permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BUMS) course and 08 seats in 02 PG courses namely (i) Moalijat-04 seats and (ii) Kulliyat-04 seats for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
- The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Unani colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2023", and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Unani) Regulations, 2024, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. **On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects were observed:-**

**1. Biometric attendance:**

- Aadhar enabled Biometric attendance System to track attendance available for the teaching staff but **not available** for non-teaching staff and Hospital Staff.
- However, on verification with the AEBAS team, it came to notice that 37 faculties has been registered on AEBAS as login credential was granted on 05.03.2025. 07 out of 37 faculties are not fulfilling the minimum AEBAS requirement. The details are as under:-**

### 8. Visitors Observation:

- All the OPDs are functional however are deficient in equipment/instruments required as per regulations. There is no screening OPD, emergency OPD and Ilmul sumoom OPD
- The staff was found not on their stations during visitation. Besides there was deficiency of instruments and equipment as well.
- The pharmacognosy laboratory has not been established in the college. Drug testing laboratories is available in the pharmacy 200metres away from the college building.
- There is a deficiency of pharmacology laboratory and pharmacognosy laboratory in the college. Drug testing laboratory is required to be shifted in the main academic block.

3) Accordingly, the assessment report has been carefully examined in terms concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations there under and as per the direction of competent authority the assessment report was placed in **140<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment**

and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 12.08.2025. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above, the Board discussed and decided to provide an opportunity of hearing to college for the remaining shortcoming.

- 4) Further, an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of even no. dated 19.08.2025 was provided to you to appear on 20.08.2025 before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to why not the permission to your college for the academic session 2025-26 be denied.
- 5) The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions vide letter. ref. no. AUMC/PRINCIPAL/0435 dated 20.08.2025 against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, Prof. Ahmad Ali Khan, Principal of the college appeared before the Hearing Committee on 20.08.2025 and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. 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- 6) Thereafter, the observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Unani colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2023", and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Unani) Regulations, 2024, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunde and the recommendation of Hearing Committee was duly placed before the **143<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 26.08.2025 and Board decided that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations but fulfilling the criteria for issuance of Extended Permission in accordance with the Board's policy letter issued on 23.01.2025. Hence, the Board decided to issue the Extended permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BUMS) course and 08 seats in 02 PG courses namely (i) Moalijat-04 seats and (ii) Kulliyat-04 seats for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**

#### "DECISION"

- 7) **Therefore, Extended Permission is hereby granted to Aligarh Unani Medical College & ACN Hospital, AUAMC Campus, Kasimpur Road, Aligarh-202002, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID: UNI0309) with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BUMS) course and 08 seats in 02 PG courses namely (i) Moalijat-04 seats and (ii) Kulliyat-04 seats in accordance with Regulation 16 (1) of MESAR UG (Unani) 2023 & Regulation 16 (5) of MESAR PG Unani, 2024 and as per the Policy letter dated 23.01.2025 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and subject to the condition that the following requirements shall be fulfilled: -**
- I. **Minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BUMS) course and 08 seats in 02 PG courses** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
  - II. Determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 8) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 9) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or
